Item	Description
Course Length	The course runs over nine weeks of study (with a one-week study break in the middle of the term), followed by two-week period for marking and feedback.
Course Description	Advance your knowledge of project management and learn to develop successful business cases, forecasts and stakeholder strategies. Developed by Project Management Consultant Sean Whitaker Are you a project manager looking to deepen your understanding of key frameworks or an experienced leader looking for your next professional development? Advance your career as a professional project manager through our flexible online learning. You'll practice techniques to manage multiple projects or programmes as well as how to develop culturally responsive strategies in line with Te Tiriti o Waitangi (the Treaty of Waitangi). Develop your understanding of leadership and forecasting, explore some methodologies such as Agile, and learn to build your own bespoke project methodology that works for your practice. Exploring real examples of projects in action, you'll learn how to apply advanced project management skills to your own practice. If you're new to project management, our <u>Professional Project Management</u> course is designed for you to gain the fundamental skills you need. If you already have knowledge and experience as a project manager or have completed that course and want to deepen your practice, we'd recommend going straight into this course.

Learning Impact	This course provides a continuation of the foundational knowledge required to be a successful project manager, following current ISO standards. Learners will develop knowledge, terminology, tools, and techniques used by the Aotearoa New Zealand project management profession. Learners will be able to put together their own methodology to align with the needs, risks, hazards, and specifications of their workplace projects.				
Delivery	This course is 100% online, which means you can log on when it suits you to fit learning into your life, so long as you meet assessment deadlines. You will need to work through the course materials and assessments in the relevant weeks, as outlined below in the course schedule.				
Estimated hours per week	We estimate your engagement will be about 6-8 hours a week over the eight learning weeks (excluding the one-week study break).				
Qualification	This is a standalone course that recognises the achievement of specific skills, experience, or knowledge. Upon successful completion of the course, you will be issued a digital badge to recognise your learning achievements. This can take up to 2 months to be delivered after the marking and feedback period.				
Academic points	Being a short course, there are no academic points associated with this course.				
Recommended prior learning	There are no prerequisites for this course although it is recommended that you have already completed our Professional Project Management course. If you already have knowledge and experience as a project manager or have completed that course and want to deepen your practice, we'd recommend this course.
